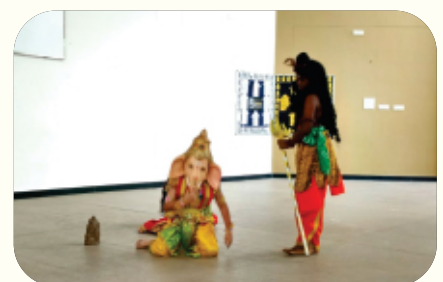


2. Janmashtami festival was celebrated with great zeal and pomp by primary children. They came dressed in Krishna and Radha outfits.
