While the Class VI - X students wrote a paragraph on 'Importance of Discipline in Students', Class VIII - X students additionally made an advertisement to promote an imaginary product.


Literary Club (Telugu):

Math Club:

Class VIII to X:

- 1) Introduction to Math Lab that can be dealt in Math Lab
- 2) Discussion of topics
- 3) Discussion of points of concurrence
- 4) To find centroid of a triangle by paper folding and to learn its properties



- 1) The information about few mathematicians and their achievements are given to the students. They've also learned the uniqueness of Ramanujan's number, which is 1729.
 - Students also shared what they know about mathematicians like Ramanujan and Euclid.
- 2) The students are given by a 4X4 magic square to solve, which when added row wise, column wise and
 - diagonally should give 34 as total, in all 28 ways.

Students enjoyed in solving that square and two of them came out with the solution.
