✓ **Advertisements:**

Buy Buy Buy ...

As we all are aware Advertising is an audio or visual form of marketing communication that employs an openly sponsored, non-personal message to promote or sell a product, service or idea.

Children see lots of advertising every day. The ability to spot advertising and understand what advertisements are trying to do is an important life skill, which can help child development.



✓ **Action Game:**

Action Games are the perfect balance of learning and leisure. The action game emphasizes physical challenges, including hand-eye coordination and reaction-time

✓ **Conversation:**

Conversation is a form of interactive communication between two or more people. Typically, it occurs in spoken communication, as written exchanges are usually not referred to as conversations.

The development of conversational skills is an important part of child's growth.



✓ **Mental Math:**

With mental math calculations, children can improve their ability to add numbers by learning to use some basic patterns.

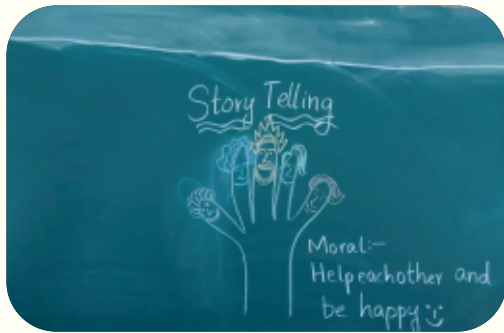
Mental math skills will improve ability to estimate results, thus having a better ability to catch errors from computer-derived results.



✓ **Story Telling:**

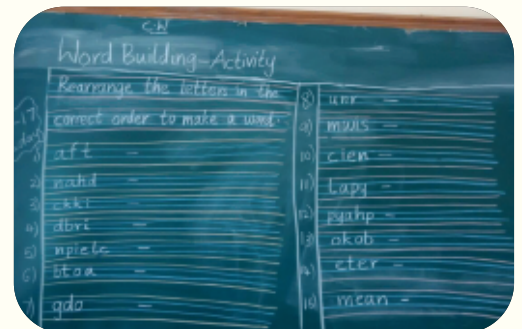

A big advantage of storytelling is that listening to stories enhances a child's vocabulary.



✓ **Word Building:**
