Won various inter House competitions.





Interesting Space Information:

Isn't it interesting to realise that our planet isn't the only one which can support life? Well, the best part is that, this is probably true! And by using multiple space telescopes like the hubble space telescope, James Webb space telescope and many other telescopes, many space agencies like NASA, ESA, etc have looked at the sky and spotted planets just like ours! And to look into the deep details of such planets, the European Space Agency or ESA is fabricating a telescope named PLATO or PLAnetary Transits and Oscillations of stars, which can measure the distance of the planet from the star it is orbiting so that we can understand if the planet is in a position where liquid water can exist on the planet's surface, if it is tidally locked to the star it is orbiting and much more! The telescope can also provides physical details of the planet itself with careful calculations.



The above picture is an artist's representation of the PLATO telescope in space.

The space telescope is expected to launch at the end of 2026. And with these many discoveries being made about outer space, it makes a lot of sense why we should be excited about our future!











