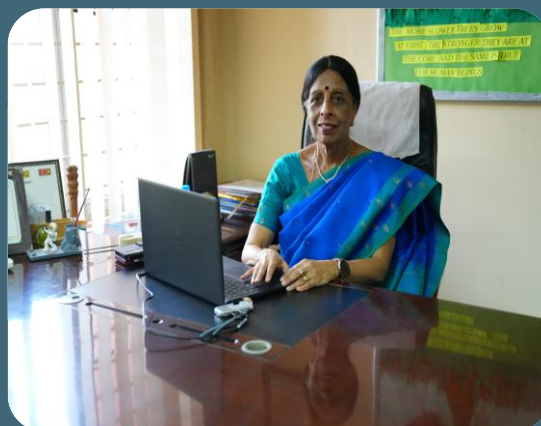

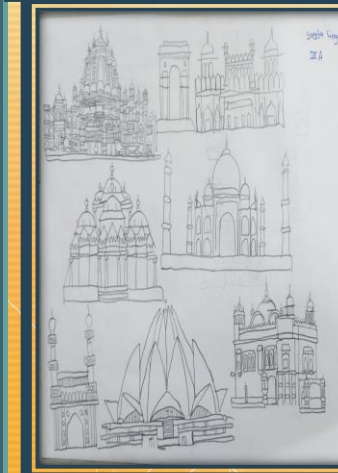
Plant-Based Plastics: A Step Toward A Cleaner Future

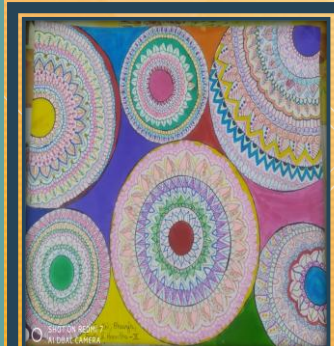
Mother, my lovely mother;

Aditya L1 is India's first space-based mission dedicated to studying the Sun. Launched by ISRO (Indian Space Research Organisation) on September 2, 2023.

- The spacecraft will be positioned in a halo orbit around the Sun-Earth Lagrange point (L1).
- Aditya L1 carries seven scientific payloads.
- These instruments will help scientists investigate key solar phenomena like coronal heating, solar winds etc
- The mission's primary objectives are to study the Sun's outer layers and better understand space weather.
- The mission aims to provide new insights into the Sun's influence on the space environment surrounding Earth.

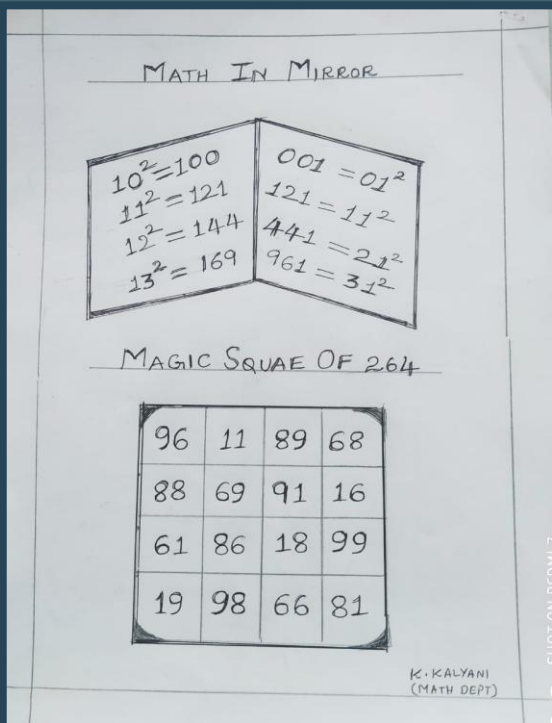

Planetary parade 2025

This celestial phenomenon, known as a planetary parade or alignment, occurs when several planets in our solar system appear to form a line from our vantage point on Earth.

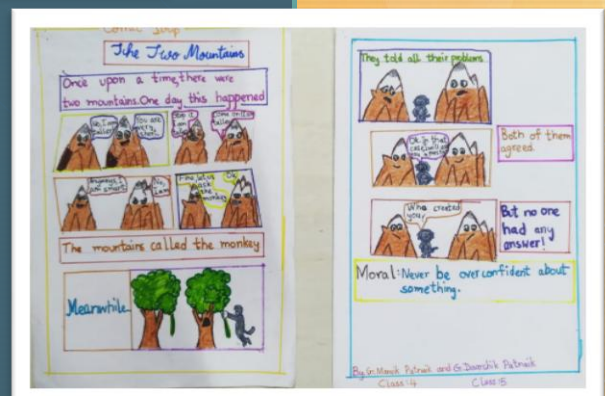
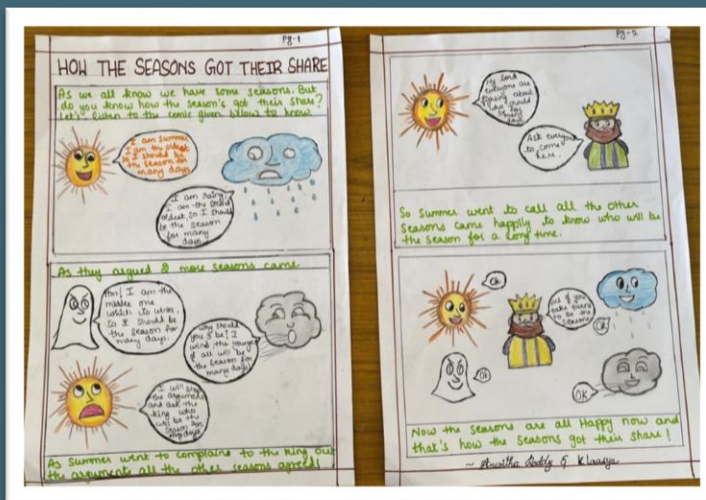
- Throughout January and February six planets – Venus, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus and Neptune – have been visible in the night sky.
- During just one night – 28 February – they were joined by Mercury, a rare seven-planet alignment visible in the sky. It is a spectacle that will not be visible again until 2040.
- Such events are just a treat for stargazers.
- They also have a real impact on our Solar System and offer the opportunity to gain new insights about our place within it.
- Mercury, Venus, Mars, Jupiter and Saturn are all bright enough to be visible to the naked eye, while Uranus and Neptune require binoculars or a telescope to spot.



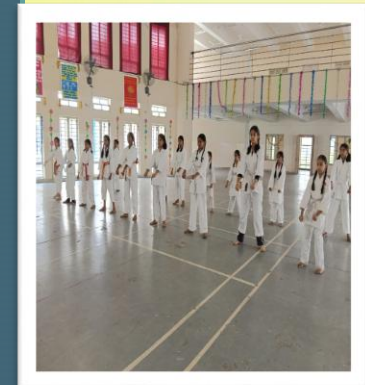

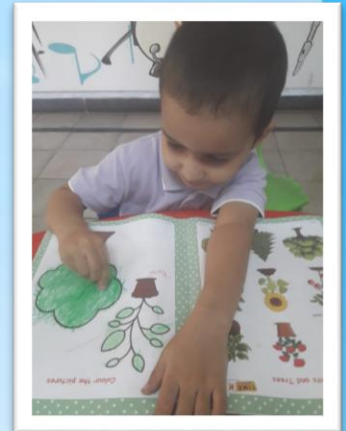
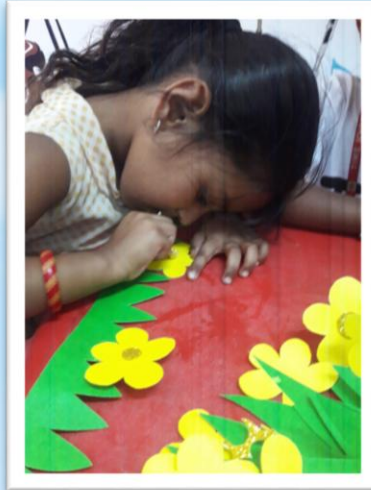
